 time. He seems to prefer 15 SSB.
 - 7Q Malawi Guys from the Russian Robinson Club will have 7Q7RU on from the Embangweni area November 7-18. They will be on 160M-70CM, focusing on the lower bands, CW, SSB, FT8 F/H and satellites.

- 8Q Maldives Today HB9SHD, Remo, made it to Kandolho Island in the Maldives. While there he will be operating on the as 8Q7RM. Remo expects to try all the bands, 160-6, and modes too, CW, FT8/4 and SSB.

Sunshine Report By Donna, W8DMP

LCARA received a message from Cal (W8BZP) that Norm Kelbley (N8FPX) passed away on November 14, 2020. Norm enjoyed amateur radio hamfests and fox hunts. Cal mentioned that Norm was a member some time ago. He lived in Phoenix, Arizona with his wife Janet.

BACKSCATTER

119 Years Ago: Guglielmo Marconi sent the first transatlantic radio signal from Poldhu in Cornwall, to St John's, Newfoundland.

59 Years Ago: The first private satellite was put into orbit. A Thor-Agena rocket, launched to deploy a military Discoverer-36 satellite, also carried the 10-lb OSCAR I. The Orbiting Satellite Carrying Amateur Radio transmitted "HI" in Morse code, 10 times a minute, and was designed and hand-built for \$63 by California radio amateurs. The battery powered a 140-mW transmitter on 144.983 MHz, transmitting for 22 days when its non-rechargeable battery failed. It burned up in the atmosphere 30 days later.

40 Years Ago: LCARA's first upgrade class starts, held at the Mentor Christian Church. Instructors are George, WD8OYQ and Scott, N8BOI.

The hamfest changes QTH, following a mix-up at the Mentor High School, which double books the 4th weekend in March. The Madison High School comes to the rescue, with an open date, reasonable cost and plenty of space.

Ham Radio Horizon magazine ceases publication. Aimed at relatively new amateurs, it fails to attract sufficient advertising revenue. Subscribers are given Ham Radio magazine in its place.

35 Years Ago: The FCC gives non-government radiolocation primary status at 1900 to 2000 kHz. Effective December 9th, amateur stations must not cause harmful interference to the radio location service and are afforded no protection from interference arising from radio location operations.

The November issue of QST shows LCARA placing 21st in the 5A Field Day category.

30 Years Ago: WACO! Award debuts. Lenny, WS8O announces the award will be given to amateurs in Lake, Cuyahoga and Geauga counties who work 30 LCARA members. Other North American amateurs need work 20 members, and DX stations can be WACO! by working only 10 members.

QST announces LCARA placed #1 in class 7A for Field Day, and 6th in the nation overall.

25 Years Ago: The Board recommends raising annual dues to \$20 for full members. No change is suggested for student, associate, senior or family members.

20 Years Ago: Newsletter editor Tim, KQ8TC resigns effective year-end. Ken, KC8OHF volunteers to fill the position.

The FCC writes a Wisconsin electric utility as a result of complaints of power line interference filed by two lowa amateurs. The FCC intervened after Alliant Energy of Madison indicated it already considered itself to be in compliance with applicable federal laws. The FCC explained the utility's obligation under its Part 15 rules and gave the utility 30 days to look into the situation and report back to the complainants.

15 Years Ago: The "Holyland DX Group" announces their upcoming operation from the lowest point in the Dead Sea, 411 meters below sea level, which is the lowest dry point on earth. Their call will be 4X411A.

The Hamfest Committee Meeting is to be held at the Dairy Queen on Lakeshore Blvd. in Mentor, 190 meters **above** sea level.

10 Years Ago: QST's Field Day results show LCARA placed 5th nationally in 7A, and in the top 4% of all stations.

OGASAWARA, JD1. Station JD1BHA has been active on 40 meters using CW around 1200z.

POLAND, SP. Members of the Ostrow Radio Amateur Radio Club are QRV as SN3ISS until December 21 to celebrate the 20th anniversary of active amateur radio communication service on the International Space Station.

SOMALIA, T5. Ali, EP3CQ is QRV as 60100 until January 15, 2021 while working for the UN Department of Safety and Security in Mogadishu. Activity is on 160 to 10 meters using CW, SSB and FT8.

MALI, TZ. Ulmar, DK1CE is QRV as TZ1CE and is here until December 8.

ASIATIC RUSSIA, UA0. Vladimir, R0FP is now a resident on Iturup Island, IOTA AS-025, and is active on various bands and modes.

The Ohio HF Emergency Preparedness Net is conducted every Tuesday at 7PM local time on 3850 kHz (or nearby, to adjust for interference). You may have to move up or down the band if you do not hear them near that frequency.

Please note the Net Control Station transmits from the State of Ohio Emergency Operations Center in Columbus.

OHDEN

The OHIO DIGITAL EMERGENCY NET. OHDEN is an Section Level ARES approved NBEMS **emergency** traffic net. The purpose is to provide a statewide communications conduit between the EMA/EOC'S in Ohio. The net uses sound card digital modes and NBEMS to pass written traffic. The net uses the low frequency HF bands for statewide NVIS coverage. FLDIG is the standard software. District and county level communications are provided at the local level by the DEC/EC's.

Each Ohio ARES district and county is encouraged to organize digital capabilities and to liaison to the statewide OHDEN net.

In addition, OHDEN provides training, **technical** assistance and organizational assistance in support of digital modes and NVIS communications.

During Daylight Saving Time (starting on March 08), The frequency will be 3584.500 KHz + 1500 Hz waterfall USB using Olivia 8-500.

During Standard Time (longest winter months), The frequency will be 1804.500 + 1500 Hz waterfall USB using Olivia 8-500.

During the month of March OHDEN will maintain secondary watch by an Alternate Net Control station on our secondary frequency of 1804.5 KHz to allow stations to check in on both bands and compare signal reports. Check into the primary frequency first and then (optional if you have the capability) call in on the backup 160 meter frequency after Primary NCS has recognized you and you have cleared any traffic you have.

Both of these frequencies are prime and secondary on our OHDEN frequency plan listed in the OHDEN SOG.

VE TESTS at Lake County Historical Society for December

VE TESTS move to the Lake County Historical Society for DECEMBER 5 test

After having to cancel LCARA's April and June VE tests due to closure of the Kirtland Library, then moving to a Chapin Forest picnic pavilion for the summer, we are again moving to a **new location**:

Lake County Historical Society 415 Riverside Drive Painesville

This is on the northeast corner of Riverside and Route 84, just before Riverside School.

The Historical Society is on the east side of Painesville. Coming from the west, at the intersection of I-90 and Route 44, go north on 44, then take the first exit, Route 84 and go east. Follow 84 through Painesville. After crossing the river, the Historical Society is at the top of the hill on the left. We are in The Barn towards the back of the property. Yes, it's heated.

The tests will start at **12 noon.** Please arrive a few minutes earlier. We hope to have plenty of seats available.

On test day, you will need to complete the NCVEC 605 Form, which will be available at the test. If you would like to do this ahead of time, be sure it is the Sept 2017 version or later. You can find it by Googling "NCVEC quick-form 605" and clicking on the url for a pdf of the form.

Be sure to bring **the <u>original</u> and a copy of both your license and any CSCEs you may have to the exam.** The cost is \$15.00, and if you wish to pay by check, it should be made out to the ARRL/VEC. Identification with your picture is also necessary, such as a driver's license. PATRIOTIC..... with station and skill always ready for service to country and community.
