 - Software-Defined Radio (with a \$20 RTLSDR dongle)
 - Digital Voice Hotspot (pi-star)
 - Retro Gaming Machine (with RetroPie)
 - APRS Digipeater/I-Gate (xastir, aprx)
 - Logging (cqrlog)
 - Antenna Rotator control

Dave's presentation was very interesting and very informative. Several members had questions for him and asked for additional information. The group enjoyed his presentation and were grateful to Dave for sharing his knowledge and expertise with us.

 - o 5H Tanzania 5H1FF Frans, is on the air from Arusha, 40 meters and up, FT8 and PSK31.
 - GJ Jersey MJ/HB9GWJ is on holiday in St. Helier, on the island, July 30 to August 8. Op
 Olivier has 80 watts to an end fed antenna for HF and a grid antenna for satellite QO-100,
 covering 40-6M and SSB and FT8 modes.
 - HK Colombia Colombia's telecom has issued a special call to LCRA, the Colombia Amateur Radio League. The callsign is 5K87LR. This one is expected to be on "all bands and modes" the rest of this month.
 - HL South Korea To mark the 75th anniversary of Liberation Day, August 15, 1945 special
 event station HL75V will be QRV under the organization of the Korean Amateur Radio League
 (KARL) Chungbuk Headquarters. Activity will take place from the CheongJu-Si ChungBuk area
 between August 1st and 31st. They will be on all bands and modes.
 - TK Corsica TK/DJ0TOP, Frans, plans an August 6 to September 14 operation. During the International Lighthouse/Lightship Weekend August 22-23 he will be at the Phare (lighthouse) d'Alistro.

175 Years Ago: Jean-Maurice-Émile Baudot is born. A French engineer who received a patent on a telegraph code in 1874 that later superceded Morse Code as the most commonly used telegraphic alphabet. He later developed a fast-printing telegraph which could transmit six simultaneous messages.

62 Years Ago: Jack Kilby demonstrated his invention of a miniaturized electronic circuit to his supervisor at Texas Instruments, now recognized as the first integrated circuit to be built and operated. In 1959 he applied for a patent, eventually issued in June of 1964.

40 Years Ago: The first planning meeting for the 1981 Hamfest will take place at Tom, N8BLL's QTH.

The 81/21 Ham-O-Gram has a new editor! Old Editor Mike, WD8IVL gives his position, and sells his computer (a TRS-80) to New Editor Gary Kneisley, KA8IQA.

35 Years Ago: A new version of the Russian woodpecker appears on 20 meters. The FCC df's it to Odessa, USSR, near the Black Sea. Pretty much staying near 14 MHz, it takes up approximately 30 KHz of spectrum. The FCC's Treaty Division lodges a protest.

George, KD8...FJ operates amateur radio station K2BSA from Hill, Virginia. Each day for seven days hundreds of boys, leaders and others pass through the station, which operates SSTV and RTTY, as well as HF and FM. Over 3100 items of traffic are handled.

20 Years Ago: LCARA plans to hold a General upgrade class, to cover both theory and code. With only 5 WPM required, General is easier than ever.

15 Years Ago: Section Manager Joe Phillips, K8QOE will speak to the club at the September meeting.

Club Prez Doug, K8NFF wins the first two hourly door prizes at the club picnic.

10 Years Ago: LCARA meetings move to the Cleveland Clinic at I-90 and 91 in Willoughby.

5 Years Ago: LCARA begins Technician classes at the Historical Society. Taught by Matt Welch, W8DEC, they run once weekly for five weeks, with the exam on the 6th evening.

DX Alert, September 2020

OZ200EM - In memory of Hans Christian Orsted, who 200 years ago discovered that electric currents create magnetic fields, special event station OZ200EM will be QRV from Virum (EU-029) through the end of this year.

KENYA, **5Z**. Andy, G3AB is now QRV as 5Z4VJ from Nairobi.

NORTH COOK ISLANDS, E5. Warwick, E51WL is QRV from Penrhyn Atoll, IOTA OC-082. Activity of late has been on 20 meters using FT8 and FT4. He may soon be active on 2 meters EME.

DENMARK, OZ. Special call sign OZ200EM is QRV until the end of 2020 to celebrate the 200th anniversary of the discovery of electromagnetism by Hans Christian Orsted.

HONG KONG, VR. Special call sign VR2HK9O is QRV until May 31, 2021 to celebrate the 90th anniversary of the Hong Kong Amateur Radio Transmitting Society.

CAMBODIA, XU. Tad, JA1DFK is QRV as either XU7AKU or XU7AKV from Phnom Penh during the next couple of years. Activity is on the HF bands using mainly CW and SSB with some digital activity.

ADDED NOTES:

TF - Iceland - DJ7JC, Norbert, will be moving around Iceland with a Camper for eight weeks. Activity "holiday style" as TF/DJ7JC will be on 1.8 through 28 MHz on CW, FT8 and RTTY until October 14.

OX – Greenland - OZ1DJJ, Bo, will be QRV as OX3LX starting August 24th. Plans are to operate from Islands designated (NA-134), through September 20th.

T6 – Afghanistan - S53R arrived back in Kabul August 25 with T6AA his regular call and T6A in contests.

9H – Malta - In September DL2AAZ, Reiner will be active from Gozo Island using special call 9H3SAT. Activity will be on the HF bands, 6 meters and especially on Satellite QO-100.

LY – Latvia - LY784A celebrates the 784 years of the town, Siauliai. This one will be on CW and SSB until September 30.

YB – Indonesia - 8A387KRW is a special call for the 387th anniversary of the Karawang District, on the air September 11- 14. The plan is to be on 80, 40, 15, 20 and 2, CW, SSB, FM and FT8.

OHEPN

The Ohio HF Emergency Preparedness Net is conducted every Tuesday at 7PM local time on 3850 kHz (or nearby, to adjust for interference). You may have to move up or down the band if you do not hear them near that frequency.

Please note the Net Control Station transmits from the State of Ohio Emergency Operations Center in Columbus.

OHDEN

The OHIO DIGITAL EMERGENCY NET. OHDEN is an Section Level ARES approved NBEMS **emergency** traffic net. The purpose is to provide a statewide communications conduit between the EMA/EOC'S in Ohio. The net uses sound card digital modes and NBEMS to pass written traffic. The net uses the low frequency HF bands for statewide NVIS coverage. FLDIG is the standard software. District and county level communications are provided at the local level by the DEC/EC's.

Each Ohio ARES district and county is encouraged to organize digital capabilities and to liaison to the statewide OHDEN net.

In addition, OHDEN provides training, **technical** assistance and organizational assistance in support of digital modes and NVIS communications.

During Daylight Saving Time (starting on March 08), The frequency will be 3584.500 KHz + 1500 Hz waterfall USB using Olivia 8-500.

During Standard Time (longest winter months), The frequency will be 1804.500 + 1500 Hz waterfall USB using Olivia 8-500.

During the month of March OHDEN will maintain secondary watch by an Alternate Net Control station on our secondary frequency of 1804.5 KHz to allow stations to check in on both bands and compare signal reports. Check into the primary frequency first and then (optional if you have the capability) call in on the backup 160 meter frequency after Primary NCS has recognized you and you have cleared any traffic you have.

Both of these frequencies are prime and secondary on our OHDEN frequency plan listed in the OHDEN SOG.

VE TESTS stay at Metroparks for OCTOBER

After having to cancel LCARA's April and June VE tests due to closure of the Kirtland Library, the August 1st test moved to a **new location**:

Lake County Metroparks
Chapin Forest Reservation
9938 Chillicothe Road (Rt 306)
Quarry Shelter

This worked well, and since the Library is still uncertain, we will also hold the tests at the Metropark on October 3. Quarry Shelter is a covered picnic pavilion, so be sure to dress accordingly.

Chapin Forest is 3.3 miles south of I-90 on Route 306, in Kirtland. This is 1.6 miles south of the library. The park is on the west (the right side going south) of 306. The Quarry Shelter is almost immediately on the right as one enters the reservation.

The tests will start at **12 noon.** Please arrive a few minutes earlier. Reserving a spot is suggested, although we hope to have plenty of seats available.

On test day, you will need to complete the NCVEC 605 Form, which will be available at the test. If you would like to do this ahead of time, be sure it is the Sept 2017 version or later. You can find it by Googling "NCVEC quick-form 605" and clicking on the url for a pdf of the form.

Be sure to bring the <u>original</u> and a copy of both your license and any CSCEs you may have to the exam. The cost is \$15.00, and if you wish to pay by check, it should be made out to the ARRL/VEC. Identification with your picture is also necessary, such as a driver's license.
