Backscatter for June 2021

BACKSCATTER

410 Years Ago: Sunspots are discovered. Johannes Fabricius, a Dutch astronomer published "Narration on Spots Observed on the Sun and their Apparent Rotation with the Sun." On Mar 9, 1611, Johannes had used his telescope to view the rising sun and saw several dark spots, calling his father to investigate this new phenomenon with him. The brightness of the Sun's center was very painful to view, and the two quickly switched to a projection method by means of a camera obscure.

173 Years Ago: Samuel F. B. Morse obtained a reissued patent for Morse code

96 Years Ago: The first telecast in the U.S. of objects in motion was made by Charles Jenkins. He called it "visions by radio." The first mechanical TV system broadcast used 48 scanning lines and showed a model of Dutch windmill with its blades turning.

40 Years Ago: The 3rd annual Hamfest is now history, with Chairman Tom, N8BLL leading the somewhat more experienced team. Following previous years' hamfests at the Painesville armory and the Mentor High School, this year's hamfest is held at the Madison High School.

The repeater grows 60'!! On Sunday, April 26 the antenna was raised on a new steel tower, mounted on a concrete pad constructed over the last several months. Radio Officer Rusty gives thanks to Ron WB8UGW, Bill WD8CFK, Dave WD8DQW, Gary KA8IQA, and TJ KA8IPX.

BIH in Paris, France, announces that a positive leap-second will occur at the end of June. Following 23h 59m 59s on June 30th will be both 23h 59m 60s and 00h 00m 00s.

35 Years Ago: The FCC states that it may be illegal to suggest a selling price for 3rd party equipment listed on swap nets.

In an active month, the FCC also states that outdated rules have contributed to the decline of AM broadcasting. In response, they recommend relaxation of restrictions on ownership, signal interference, and suggest allowing daytime-only stations to broadcast full time.

Price increases of up to 20% since October are noted in a number of imported rigs. With the yen at 180 per dollar vs 240 in September, a depreciating dollar is blamed for making US exports cheaper, and imports more expensive.

30 Years Ago: Ken, WT8F and Bruce, N8LXS make the 1st WACO satellite contact. After arrangements on the 444.65 repeater, they link up Mode A (145.886 up, 29.886 down), logging both CW and SSB QSOs using the Russian RS-10/11.

In QRM ES QRN ES QSB DE K8BL, Bob discusses both the highlights and lowlights of the 2nd VP2EOH DXpedition to Anguilla. Despite ground loop problems with the antenna rotor causing "lots of BIG sparks" whenever the power supply touched the IC-735 rig, roughly 3500 contacts are made. At least last year's problem of 70 VAC showing on the coax was not repeated.

A bill making its way through the Ohio House would severely restrict "communication towers" to 35' above grade. Exemptions are made if the tower is at least one thousand feet from the nearest residence, and the minimum setback of the tower is equal to the tower's height.

20 Years Ago: The program at June's club meeting will be a guest speaker from the Ohio Area Repeater Council.

15 Years Ago: Tom Brown, KB8WFD, SK.

10 Years Ago: The News Herald reports on LCARA's Field Day operation at the Lake County History Center. Mike Goffos is quoted, saying "it's an annual practice for emergency communications [and] it simulates emergency situations. Another ham states "it's an excuse to go out and play and see if this [equipment] really works.

Lost Vermont Amateur Found!

A Vermont amateur radio operator was found today in a remote hallway within the Hara Arena complex, three days after the end of the Hamvention. Officials at a news conference identified the man as Gerry Mapleshire and described him as being found "disoriented, hungry, and with three days of beard growth."

After medical technicians revived his blood sugar by providing a leftover \$6 Hamvention hotdog, Mapleshire recalled what happened:

"It was shoulder-to-shoulder on the arena floor. I remember a nice looking lady handing me a free Kenwood cloth bag full of brochures and a lapel pin, then the crowd shifted and I was pushed into the MFJ booth" said Mapleshire.

"I got on my hands and knees and crawled out of the MFJ booth. I got to the arena floor ramp but the crowd was so thick. I somehow ended up in a hallway by the loading docks, without my Kenwood bag," he said.

He wandered through dark hallways trying to find his way out of the vast complex for three days before a maintenance worker found him. "I called for help on 146.520 but no one answered," said Mapleshire.

Hamvention information deputy Ned Doubtman investigated why his radio call went unanswered. "Turns out he was transmitting WITHOUT a PL tone. Everyone here blocks out QRM by using PL on transmit and receive. It's no wonder he wasn't heard," said Doubtman.

Mapleshire says he's still recovering from the traumatic experience, but would like to get in touch with someone from Kenwood so he can get his lapel pin.

\$35!??!!

As rumored, the FCC will begin charging a \$35 "Application Fee" in the near future. No date has been announced yet, but it will likely be this summer. It will apply to:

New Licenses - Upgrades - Renewals - Vanity Calls

It will **NOT** apply to name changes, address changes, or e-mail address changes.

New license applicants at VE tests will still pay a \$15 test fee, and after the test, successful applicants will need to pay the new \$35 fee directly to the FCC via their Pay Fees System.

This will not be effective until the Commission updates their systems and publishes notice in the Federal Register. When this happens and if your license is coming up for renewal, you may want to see if you are in the 90 day renewal window and save \$35.

June 2021 DX Alert



- **TY Benin** Ian, ZS6JSI, has been on the air with the ZS5JSI/TY call sign since January, and has now gotten the TY5AB call sign. He is doing some 20M FT8 and has just got an amplifier, with plans to get on other bands and modes. He is in Benin through June.
- **5N Nigeria 5N7MSF** is in Nigeria until September 15,. He says he will try to get on the air as much as possible after his working hours and Saturdays and Sundays. He particularly mentions 14122 and 21170. US ops will hope he listens split in the US band.
- **4K Azerbaijan** The 4K880NZM call sign is for the 880 years since the birth of poet Nizami Ganjavi. Using this unusual call sign is operator 4K4K from Baku.
- **FM Martinique** FM/OQ3R by ON4RU/OQ3R, from the FM5BH QTH, is planned to June 5, holiday style on 160-10, CW only.
- **HH Haiti** HH2JA, Peter, began operation with his antenna on his hotel balcony. Currently he is in Pétionville, planning a 3-year stay.
- **VP2V British Virgin Islands** VP2V/NC3Z, Gary Mitchelson, will be on the air June 3-14.
- **YL Latvia** YL21ICE is a special call sign for the Ice Hockey World Championship to be held in Riga May 21 to June 6. Operation will be from various locations there and on 160-10M including 30, 17 and 12 and VHF/UHF, CW, SSB, RTTY and FT8/4.
- **K9X Christmas Island** VK6SJ, Steve, has a trip planned to the island for May 25 to June 15. He will get on the air outside of his work schedule, probably nighttime and mainly FT8. His call sign will be VK9XX.
- **TA Turkey** TC568FA is a special call sign, slated to go to June 28. The ops are TA0TA, TA0APA, TA6CQ, TA3X, TA1C1, TA3LHH, TA2MN, TA1EF and TA3ST. The operation commemorates the 568th anniversary of the conquest of Istanbul. Look for them on 160-10, SSB, CW and digital modes.
- **5**U **Niger** Adrien, F4IHM is now QRV as 5UAIHM until June 27 while on work assignment. Activity is in his spare time on 40 and 20 meters using CW and SSB.
- **5R Madagascar** Daniel, 6W7RP is QRV as 5R8RP from Nosy Be, IOTA AF-057. Activity is on 40 to 6 meters.

Z2 – **Zimbabwe** - Peter, PA3CPI is now QRV as Z21DX and has been active on 20 meters using SSB between 1740 and 1800z.

"The first wireless operators were landline telegraphers who left their offices to go to sea or to man the coastal stations. They brought with them their language and much of the tradition of their older profession. In those early days, every station occupied the whole spectrum with its broad spark signal.

Government stations, ships, coastal stations and the increasingly numerous amateur operators all competed for time and signal supremacy in each other's receivers. Many of the amateur stations were very powerful. Two amateurs, working each other across town, could effectively jam all the other operations in the area.

Frustrated commercial operators would refer to the ham radio interference by calling them "hams." Amateurs, possibly unfamiliar with the real meaning of the term, picked it up and applied it to themselves. As the years advanced, the original meaning has completely disappeared."

HAM EXAMS IN LAKE COUNTY EVERY OTHER MONTH

The Lake County Amateur Radio Association VE Team will be holding Amateur Radio licensing exams on the following dates in 2021:

Saturday, June 5* Saturday, August 7

Saturday, October 2 Saturday, December 4

This bi-monthly schedule is the first Saturday of every even-numbered month (e.g., February being the second month, etc.). Testing sessions are **usually** held at the Kirtland Library, 9267 Chillicothe Road. It is 1.7 miles south of I-90 on Route 306 (Chillicothe Rd). The library is on the left, just beyond the Marathon gas station

* Note that the June test session will be held at: Lake County Historical Society, 415 Riverside Drive, Painesville Twp. (Located at Riverside and Route 84, just west of Riverside High School)

The tests will start at **12 noon.** Please arrive a few minutes earlier.

To register, you will need a NCVEC 605 Form, which will be available at the test. If you would like to complete one ahead of time, be sure it is the Sept 2017 version or later. You can find it by Googling "NCVEC quick-form 605" and clicking on the url for a pdf of the form. The FCC now requests you provide a FRN, although your Social Security Number still works, at least for now. If you are new to ham radio and don't have a FRN, Google "New FRN" and follow the apps.fcc.gov link.

Be sure to bring **a copy of your license to the exam.** The cost is \$15.00, and if you wish to pay by check, it should be made out to the ARRL/VEC. LOYAL..... Offering loyalty, encouragement and support to other amateurs, local clubs and the American Radio Relay League, through which Amateur Radio in the United States is represented nationally and internationally.

PROGRESSIVE..... With knowledge abreast of science, a well built and efficient station and operation beyond reproach.

FRIENDLY..... With slow and patient operation when requested, friendly advice and counsel to the beginner, kindly assistance, co-operation and consideration for the interests of others. These are the hallmarks of the amateur spirit.

BALANCED..... Radio is an ad vocation, never interfering with duties owed to family, job, school or community.

PATRIOTIC..... With station and skill always ready for service to country and community.

LCARA was organized for the purpose of furthering Amateur Radio by increasing the technical knowledge and operating proficiency of radio amateurs through continuing education, public service and acting as a vehicle of communication by, between and with the members of the association.
