Message from the President

Greetings fellow travelers,

We've had a busy April so far. Many of our members have reported tree damage due to the late spring snow event and some experienced power outages. Thankfully, no reports of injuries but some antennas down. Let's be careful clearing up the mess. Living in northeast Ohio is so much fun!

For May's membership meeting we will again welcome Bob Heil as our guest presenter. Bob always has a lot to offer us about the world of audio engineering as it relates to our hobby and it promises to be interesting.

May 8th is World Red Cross Day and the ARC Nationwide Spring Drill Day. Our ARES group, along with other counties, will be participating in the event which this year will be focus on using the Winlink platform, and is basically a message handling exercise using the internet, VHF, UHF and HF. The goal is to demonstrate the abilities of amateur radio in partnering with our served agencies such as the Red Cross.

"The Red Cross Emergency Communication Training Group is holding its nationwide Spring Drill on World Red Cross Day, May 8. Individuals are invited to participate. In February 2020, an organizing phone call was held with a dozen Red Cross-affiliated radio amateurs to consider creating a nationwide radio drill. By May, the group had more than 100 people on the team calls, and more than 1,000 participated in that first Spring Drill. Synthesizing lessons-learned from the first event, the managing group simplified and narrowed the focus for a Fall Drill last November, choosing to concentrate on Winlink involvement. Red Cross forms are built in as templates in Winlink Express, and hams using Winlink can also send messages to non-hams. The group's goal for the Fall Drill was to attract as many hams as possible using Winlink at a basic level. Over 1700 participated from over 40 states and a few foreign countries. For next month's Spring '21 Drill, the goal is the same, but now the bar will be raised in Winlink Proficiency, and, being World Red Cross Day, more international participation will be solicited. The group has been holding regular Winlink training sessions, with the last one occurring April 8. Winlink Thursdays have been attracting over 500 participants. - ARC Emergency Communications Training Group"

GCXC has asked us to assist them with their inaugural Cleveland East Side Half Marathon on May 16th. This run starts in Fairport Harbor and winds through Painesville Township before returning to Fairport. If you are interested in coming out to play radio, get in touch with Mike (WB8ZGH) or myself.

Next month, we have a Father's Day brunch (LCHS) and another GCXC run. We will be finalizing plans for Field Day at our June meeting. All in all, lots to do and opportunities to get involved.

Meeting Minutes:

- Meeting called to order by Ed (KB8BKE) at 7:30 p.m.
- This meeting took place as an online membership meeting using the Zoom platform.
- President: Ed (KB8BKE) welcomed our presenters for this meeting Tom Revolinsky (KE8HJL) and Axel Fisser (K8AXX).

Presentation Highlights – Red Cross "Sound The Alarm" Program Presenter: Tom Revolinsky (KE8HJL)

Tom's presentation included valuable information on the Red Cross "Sound The Alarm" program. This program offers households up to three free smoke detectors each. Tom is the Disaster Program Manager for the ARC Northern Ohio Region. Several members had questions and comments for him throughout his presentation. We thank him for sharing his time and knowledge with us.

The purpose of Tom's presentation was to:

Provide details about the Red Cross "Sound The Alarm" Program and Fire Safety in the Home.

Key Take-Aways from Tom's presentation include:

- Smoke Alarms Really Do Save Lives
 - Tom encouraged everyone to get smoke alarms. Smoke alarms really do save lives. Anyone interested in obtaining free smoke alarms through the Red "Cross Sound The Alarm" program should contact Tom directly at 216-372-9913. Tom can add you to the list.
 - Every home should have a minimum of one smoke alarm on every level of the home.
 - Sleep with your doors closed to avoid smoke inhalation.
 - Avoid installing smoke alarms within 20 feet of cooking appliances.
 - Don't install smoke alarms in attics, bathrooms, or garages because humidity may set them
 off.
 - Don't install smoke alarms near furnaces, fire heaters, forced air feeding or cooling vents, exterior doors, or windows, ceiling fans, never in a corner or within four inches of the ceiling or the wall.
 - The smoke alarms the Red Cross provide are photoelectric.
 - They detect smoldering fires.
 - They have a ten year battery.
 - It is recommended each be tested monthly by hitting the test button. At minimum do it twice per year.
 - Keep them dust free.
 - Don't Paint them.

Causes of Fires

- About 50% of fires happen in the kitchen, 1/3 of them due to unattended cooking
- Space heaters, baseboards, fireplaces
- Alarmed and/or small appliances plugged into power strips. Power strips can fail and smoke and catch on fire. They can overload.
- Children playing with lighters.
- The Red Cross helps everyone regardless of race, religion, or income level.
- The Red Cross provides:
 - Immediate funds and case worker referrals for families so they can get hotels, food, and clothing.
 - Assists with replacement of loss of medications, glasses, and medical equipment.
 - Mental health professionals to assist with coping skills.

- If there is a fatality, the Red Cross provides bereavement assistance.
- Tom recommends everyone gets smoke detectors and carbon monoxide detectors for their homes. If you know anyone who has had a fire, tell them to call 1-800-REDCROSS. The Red Cross can provide them with assistance 24 hours a day, 365 days per year. Hearing impaired smoke alarms are also available if needed.

75 Years Ago: The first magnetic tape recorder is demonstrated by Jack Mullin.

- **61 Years Ago:** A synthetic ruby crystal laser was first operated at Hughes Research Laboratories in Malibu, California. The laser is a device that produces monochromatic coherent light. Invented by American physicist Theodore Maiman, he was issued U.S. Patent 3,353,115
- **40 Years Ago:** Field Day will again be held at Camp Stigwandish. A challenge is offered to the Lake Geauga Amateur Radio Club, with the winner being the club with the highest average total points per transmitter. No stakes were determined, nor any handicaps offered.
- **35 Years Ago:** Effective March 14, BBS operators are responsible for all traffic handled by their stations, including 3rd party traffic, per FCC PR docket 85 105. Many BBS's plan to shut down completely, other than when a control op is physically present.

The FCC denies a request for wavier by K6ADA, owner of London Bridge Broadcasting, to permit him to use amateur radio in news gathering for broadcast over his commercial low power television station.

30 Years Ago: A new Honda 2.2 KW club generator is ordered, to replace the previous 5 KW unit.

The phone company agrees to reduce the monthly fee for the autopatch phone line from commercial rates to lower residential rates.

- **29 Years Ago:** The space shuttle Endeavour completes its maiden voyage, landing in the California desert.
- **25 Years Ago:** LCARA members nearly sweep the sweepstakes! In the CW category, members win all classes for the entire Great Lakes Division. Tony WA8RJF wins QRP, Ron K8NZ wins Hi Power, and Bob K8BL takes Low Power Class A. Other excellent totals are submitted by N8LXS, WT8C, KG8TS, WD8LTM, WA8TWM, WA8ZTC, and KG8QL.
- **20 Years Ago:** Dee Logan, W1HEO operates from Grenada, J3 for two weeks. Along with friend Paul from Houston plus wives, they make 3605 QSO's, with nearly half of them on 10 meters.
- **15 Years Ago:** In an interview, Fritz, K8WLF reveals that at one time he sang in a Barbershop Quartet, and "still gets back once and a while and 'Busts a few chords' with the guys."

10 Years Ago: Bob K8QXO has a number of Heathkit items for sale.

The Club's minutes state under Old Business that "Connie KB8ZXZW did not write the check for Reno's new radio."

5 Years Ago: The "Garfield Gang", consisting of Larry K8LPC, Mike WB8ZGH, Ed KB8BKE, and Rick W8QL activate the James A Garfield Home National Parks on the Air (NPOTA) site. 138 QSO's are made. Four weeks later the same gang along with Jim AA8OY, Bill N8IJG, and Doug KD8F make another 187 contacts.

BELARUS, EW - Special event station EV76F is QRV as part of the Brest Hero-Fortress memorial station in honor of the 76th anniversary of the end of World War II.

MONGOLIA, JT - Members of the JTDXA Team are QRV with special event call sign JU100DX to commemorate the 100 years since the Mongolian People's Revolution.

SVALBARD, JW - Tom, LA6VDA will be QRV as JW6VDA from Spitsbergen Island, IOTA EU-026, from April 26 to May 9. Activity will be on the HF bands using SSB.

SOMALIA, T5 - Ali, EP3CQ will be QRV as 6O1OO from Mogadishu for two months beginning on April 25. Activity will be in his spare time on the HF bands using mostly FT8.

KALININGRAD, UA2 - Special call signs RK75AK, RK75FF, and RK75FU are QRV until July 31 to commemorate the 75th anniversary of Kaliningrad.

NIGER, **5U** — F4IHM, Adrien, is heading back to Niamey, Niger where he plans to once again be QRV as 5UAIHM between May 10 and June 15. Activity will be on CW on 40 and 20 meters.

VATICAN, **HV** - New Vatican callsign HV9SMG will be on SSB, CW and digital modes, 1500 watts, dipoles for 40, 20 and 10 and a vertical but will work around Vatican Radio's high power regular shortwave broadcasts.

CHRISTMAS ISLAND - VK9X - Starting May 7th and lasting through May 28th VK6SJ, Steve, will be here as VK9XX concentrating on FT8 on 80, 40 and 30 meters, in his spare time.

FALKLAND ISLANDS, VP8 -- Newly licensed VP8DKP, Clint, is the son of VP8ADR. Bobby Short. Clint is "starting out with HF" Listen for him on FT8 on 40 meters during his evenings.

FALKLAND ISLANDS, VP8 - M0ZMS, Matthew, is being assigned to the RAF station at Mount Pleasant in the Falklands late this month to late August. He will have the VP8ZMS callsign, hopefully able to use the club station hamshack there. He is expected to do digital modes, CW and "some SSB."

YOTA Announces New Three-Times-a-Year Contest

"Team YOTA" of Youngsters on the Air in IARU Region 1 has announced it will sponsor a new contest, the YOTA Contest. Open to all radio amateurs, it takes place three times a year and runs just

12 hours. YOTA said the aim is to boost on-the-air activity by younger radio amateurs and to support YOTA. The contest will take place on different 12-hour windows on three Saturdays.

The opening event will be on May 22, 0800 – 1959 UTC. The other two in 2021 will be July 17, 1000 – 2159 UTC, and December 30, 1200 – 2359 UTC.

YOTA has established eight different operating categories, which include sub-categories for operators age 25 and younger, but operators of all ages may participate. Covering 80, 40, 20, 15, and 10 meters, the allowable modes will be CW and SSB.

The contest exchange will be the age of the participating operator. Different ages serve as score multipliers during the contest. Stations may work the same station once per band mode.

Contacts between the station's own continent are worth 1 point, while working DX is worth 3 points. The most points will be achieved by working the youngest operators. "The younger the operator, the more points one will get for the QSO," YOTA said.

The IARU Region 1 Youth Working Group is working with Hungary's IARU member-society MRASZ, the Hungarian Amateur Radio Society. MRASZ is providing a contest log robot among other things.

Submit Cabrillo logs only. Contest winners will be announced once logs received have been checked in the various categories. Winners will be awarded with a YOTA Contest plaque.

The contest committee consists of the IARU Region 1 Youth Working Group: Philipp, DK6SP, chair; Markus, DL8GM, vice-chair, and members Csaba, HA6PX, and Tomi, HA8RT.

"The first wireless operators were landline telegraphers who left their offices to go to sea or to man the coastal stations. They brought with them their language and much of the tradition of their older profession. In those early days, every station occupied the whole spectrum with its broad spark signal.

Government stations, ships, coastal stations and the increasingly numerous amateur operators all competed for time and signal supremacy in each other's receivers. Many of the amateur stations were very powerful. Two amateurs, working each other across town, could effectively jam all the other operations in the area.

Frustrated commercial operators would refer to the ham radio interference by calling them "hams." Amateurs, possibly unfamiliar with the real meaning of the term, picked it up and applied it to themselves. As the years advanced, the original meaning has completely disappeared."

Beginning on April 28, 2021, the National Weather Service will have the ability to append a "tag" to Severe Thunderstorm Warnings to trigger Wireless Emergency Alerts (WEA) for Extreme Thunderstorms:

- A "Severe Thunderstorm Warning" is a storm that can produce 58 mph winds or greater, and/or hail of 1 inch or larger, and/or a tornado
- A "Considerable Damage Threat" tag if the expected threats exist: 1.75 inch diameter hail (golf ball-sized) and/or 70 mph 79 mph thunderstorm winds.
- There is an ability to append a Destructive Damage Threat Tag if expectations are: 2.75 inch+ diameter hail (baseball-sized or larger) and/or 80 mph+ thunderstorm winds.

When might the NWS use the "Destructive" tag? Situations such as the massive derecho event that took place in the Midwest last year, where a long path of hurricane force wind damage caused an estimated \$11 Billion in damage.

HAM EXAMS IN LAKE COUNTY EVERY OTHER MONTH

The Lake County Amateur Radio Association VE Team will be holding Amateur Radio licensing exams on the following dates in 2021:

Saturday, February 6 * Saturday, August 7

Saturday, April 3 * Saturday, October 2

Saturday, June 5 * Saturday, December 4

This bi-monthly schedule is the first Saturday of every even-numbered month (e.g., February being the second month, etc.). Testing sessions are **usually** held at the Kirtland Library, 9267 Chillicothe Road. It is 1.7 miles south of I-90 on Route 306 (Chillicothe Rd). The library is on the left, just beyond the Marathon gas station

The tests will start at **12 noon.** Please arrive a few minutes earlier.

To register, you will need a NCVEC 605 Form, which will be available at the test. If you would like to complete one ahead of time, be sure it is the Sept 2017 version or later. You can find it by Googling "NCVEC quick-form 605" and clicking on the url for a pdf of the form. The FCC now requests you provide a FRN, although your Social Security Number still works, at least for now. If you are new to ham radio and don't have a FRN, Google "New FRN" and follow the apps.fcc.gov link.

Be sure to bring **a copy of your license to the exam.** The cost is \$15.00, and if you wish to pay by check, it should be made out to the ARRL/VEC. Identification with your picture is also necessary, such as a driver's license. LOYAL..... Offering loyalty, encouragement and support to other amateurs, local clubs and the American Radio Relay League, through which Amateur Radio in the United States is represented nationally and internationally.

PROGRESSIVE..... With knowledge abreast of science, a well built and efficient station and operation beyond reproach.

FRIENDLY..... With slow and patient operation when requested, friendly advice and counsel to the beginner, kindly assistance, co-operation and consideration for the interests of others. These are the hallmarks of the amateur spirit.

BALANCED..... Radio is an ad vocation, never interfering with duties owed to family, job, school or community.

PATRIOTIC..... With station and skill always ready for service to country and community.

LCARA was organized for the purpose of furthering Amateur Radio by increasing the technical knowledge and operating proficiency of radio amateurs through continuing education, public service and acting as a vehicle of communication by, between and with the members of the association.
