# **Backscatter for November 2022**

### **BACKSCATTER**

**118 Years Ago:** John Ambrose Fleming invents the thermionic valve, the first vacuum tube, and the age of modern wireless electronics is born.

The vacuum tube, a diode (having two electrodes) has had far-reaching applications. It was standard equipment in radio receivers, radar sets, early television sets and other forms of electronic communication for at least half a century, eventually being replaced by solid-state electronics.

The principle of thermionic emission, essentially the transmission of a charged current using a heated conductor, was well-understood before Fleming incorporated it into his tube. It was first reported in 1873, and a number of other engineers and physicists, including Thomas Edison, had experimented with it. Fleming's vacuum tube, however, represented a major breakthrough in the technology.

For his work, Fleming, a British citizen, received a knighthood in 1929 and was awarded the Medal of Honor by the Institute of Radio Engineers (now the Institute of Electrical and Electronics Engineers) in 1933.

**40 Years Ago:** 30 meters becomes reality! Three years after approval in WARC 79, the FCC gives US hams authorization to use 10.100 to 10.150 MHz. Initially, 10.109-10.115 MHz is withheld to protect a government station at 10.112

In a burst of activity, the FCC also proposes to eliminate virtually all logging requirements.

The 1983 FCC exam schedule in Cleveland is announced: Once in February, once in June, and once in October. Otherwise, it's a trip to Buffalo or Detroit. VE's are still years in the future.

- **35 Years Ago:** Having just installed the 440 repeater last month, funding is approved for the 220 repeater, to be installed in the spring.
- **30 Years Ago:** YU clones! The DX Advisory Committee recommends splitting Yugoslavia into five countries: Croatia 9A, Slovenia S5, Bosnia-Herzegovina YU4, Macedonia YU5, plus keeping the entity of Yugoslavia (comprised of current YU1, 6 7 & 8). Got all that? There's a test later.
- **25 Years Ago:** After more than a year as newsletter editor and significant Patch upgrades, Dee W1HEO hangs up his word processor. President Don WA8TWM begins the search for the next Editor.
- **20 Years Ago:** LCARA makes plans to run a special event station (or mid-winter Field Day) at the Red Cross chapter on Bank Street in Painesville.

**15 Years Ago:** Iraq, YI, becomes amateur radioactive, effective November 20<sup>th</sup>.

The Real Santa Claus will be active in December, operating from, where else, the Arctic Circle. Send QSL via OH9SCL.

**10 Years Ago:** The annual club dinner will be held at Rider's Inn on the 15<sup>th</sup>.

Matt Welch W8DEC will hold Technician classes on five nights in January.

Rick White W8QL, admits he still runs RTTY using a Teletype Model 28.

**5 Years Ago:** Pete, W1BKZ donated a Hallicrafters SD 160 to the club for the LCHS radio room.

Field Day results are in, and LCARA was #34 nationally, and in the top 1.1% of all entries. We were #2 of all entries in both Ohio and the Great Lakes Division.

**MADAGASCAR, 5R -** Operators PA3EWP, DL2AWG, DK2AMM, PG5M, and PA5X, will be QRV as 5R8WP, 5R8WG, 5R8MM, 5R8CG, and 5R8PA, respectively, from Nosy Be Island, IOTA AF-057, from November 22 to December 3. Most Activity will be on 160 to 6 meters using CW, SSB, RTTY, and FT8 .with two stations active.

**TOGO, 5V -** Andy, KB9IJI is QRV as 5V7JA. Activity is in his spare time on the HF bands using SSB and various digital modes

# Field Day 2022

Field Day 2022 was a bit challenging in that the Historical Society was booked for another event and necessitated relocating the stations. This made the antennas very close together and caused some interference. However, we gained good experience at adjusting to the situation and carried on to have a successful Field Day.

This year 29,679 participants made 1,274,517 QSOs while operating 4,929 stations throughout the USA and Canada. Nearly 60% of the stations were operating from home (Class D/E). Ohio led the list with 209 stations. LCARA was in Class 5A, making 1094 contacts on CW and 422 contacts on SSB. Our total score including bonus points was 6,370 points. This was good for 9<sup>th</sup> place out of 73 entries in class 5A.

We also had an offsite station, WB8SIG, operating as a LCARA station running WSJT-X digital mode. The ARRL chose to score WB8SIG separately but list their club affiliation as LCARA. They did quite well scoring 3,000 points and placed 20<sup>th</sup> out of 675 in Class D & E.

Now is the time to be thinking about Field Day 2023.

# HAM EXAMS AT THE KIRTLAND LIBRARY

The Lake County Amateur Radio Association's VE Team will be holding amateur radio license exam sessions on the following dates during 2022:

Saturday, December 3

This bi-monthly schedule is the first Saturday of every even-numbered month (e.g., February being the second month, etc.). The Kirtland Public Library is located at 9267 Chillicothe Road, 1.7 miles south of I-90 on Route 306 (Chillicothe Rd). The library is on the left, just beyond the Marathon gas station.

The tests will start at 12 noon. Please arrive a few minutes earlier.

To register, you will need a NCVEC 605 Form, which will be available at the test. If you would like to complete one ahead of time, be sure it is the Sept 2017 version or later. You can find it by Goggling "NCVEC quick-form 605" and clicking on the URL for a copy of the form. Please note **the FCC requires you to provide a FRN** (FCC Registration Number). Social Security Numbers are no longer accepted. If you are new to ham radio and don't have a FRN, Google "New FRN" and follow the apps.fcc.gov link.


If you are currently licensed, be sure to **bring a copy of your license to the exam.** The cost of the exam is \$15.00, and if you wish to pay by check, it should be made out to the ARRL/VEC. Identification with your picture, such as a driver's license is also necessary.

**In addition** the FCC now charges \$35 to add you to the Amateur Radio database. The FCC will e-mail successful candidates with instructions for payment directly to them. Payment must be made within 10 days of the e-mail. This charge does not apply to upgrades.
