BHUTAN, A5. Peter, HB9DVG is QRV as A52CC from Phodrang until December 21. Activity is on his spare time on the HF bands using SSB and FT8.

INDONESIA, YB. Special event stations 8H13H, 8H13U, 8H13T, 8G13T, 8G13A, 8G13N, 8G13G, 8G13S, 8G13E, and 8G13L will be QRV from November 26 to December 12 to commemorate the 13th anniversary of South Tangerang City. Activity will be on 80, 40, 20, 15, and 10 meters using SSB and FT8.



Backscatter for January 2022

BACKSCATTER

120 Years Ago: Guglielmo Marconi, the son of an Italian country gentleman and Irish whiskey heiress, sends the first signal across an ocean.

Taking an early interest in physics and electricity, in the attic of his villa Marconi replicated Hertz's experiments on "Hertzian waves," detecting sparks in one circuit with another circuit a few meters away. By 1895 he had extended the range to 2 kilometers.

The young inventor kept working on improvements. He sent radio signals a distance of 12 miles in 1897 and across the English Channel in 1899. The following year, he received patent No. 7777 for "tuned or synchronic telegraphy." The concept was to use different frequencies to allow simultaneous transmissions without interfering with one another. The improved signal quality also increased the range of radio transmission.

Still, there was the issue of the curvature of the Earth. Many people believed that would limit radio to local use. Marconi set out to prove them wrong.

And that he did. Assistants telegraphed a prearranged signal, the letter S (dit dit dit) from Poldhu in Cornwall, southwestern England, to Marconi at Signal Hill, St. John's, Newfoundland, at 4:30 a.m. GMT on Dec. 12, 1901. An attempt the previous night had failed when a windstorm knocked down the antenna, which was held aloft by a balloon.

By sending a signal more than 2,100 miles across the Atlantic, Marconi convincingly demonstrated the practicality of worldwide wireless communication. In 1909, he shared the Nobel Prize for physics with Karl Ferdinand Braun of Germany, whose modifications to Marconi's transmitters made them strong enough to be practical.

40 Years Ago: With cable television just installed in Lake County, the TVI committee is formed, with Rusty, WA8HAR and Frank, KA8BJA as founders.

DX spots announced on .21 and .54 include 3B7 St Brandon, and YJ New Hebrides, aka Vanuatu.

We are informed that January 4th is Burma (Mynmar) Independence Day, and January 24th is Economic Liberation Day in Togo. Also, January 18th is National Clean Up your Desk Day in the US.

Production of the 81/21 Ham-O-Gram is a team effort. It begins with editor Gary, KC8GN, using a TRS-80, who then transfers it by cassette to Bob, K8BL for printing. Finally it is hand carried to George, WD8OYQ for cutting, gluing, printing, stamping, and finally, mailing.

35 Years Ago: The Geauga County Radio Club's 147.015 repeater goes on the air. Located on a new 700 foot tower on Sperry Road, its coverage is excellent.

Solar flux levels sink further. Following levels in the 80's and 90's for several weeks, flux levels at the end of November fall to 74.

30 Years Ago: The December club meeting is cancelled due to severe weather conditions.

Bob, K8BL interrupts his usual QRM ES QRN ES QSB DE K8BL column to give the "10 Commandments of Ham Relations." Included is:

BE CONSIDERATE with the feelings of others. There are usually three sides to a controversy; yours, theirs, and the right side. If you have to think about whether you should say something over the radio, you probably shouldn't.

20 Years Ago: The FCC stops accepting license renewals through the mail due to recent Anthrax scares.

Patch Editor Ken Deken, KC8OHF includes the following 2001 events "so future readers of Backscatter (can) remember the happenings of late."

- Tora Bora is bombed relentlessly.
- Bin Laden still alive and well? Who knows?
- December temperatures through the 22nd are 20 degrees over the seasonal average.
- Gasoline prices are less than \$1.00 due partially to a new influx of Russian oil.
- Dow Industrials near 10,000
- The most popular Christmas gifts include Babblin' Boo Doll and DVD players.

15 Years Ago: LCARA meetings move from the Mentor Ice Arena building to the Painesville Red Cross.

The Red Cross institutes background checks for volunteers. This may or may not be related to the above item.

2006 Field Day results are announced, with LCARA finishing in the top 2% of the nearly 2200 stations participating, and fourth in our class. We're second in Ohio of all classes.

10 Years Ago: Mike, WB8ZGH reports the club trailer is progressing well, and will be stored in the new Lake County garage for the winter.

5 Years Ago: The FCC plans to shut down eleven field offices across the country. They do not anticipate any significant issues for the Amateur Service as a result, with OOs (Official Observers) serving as the first line of defense in Amateur Radio enforcement.

DX Alert January 2022

KERGUELEN ISLAND, FT#X - FT4XW, Arthur, is working on Kerguelen Island until late next year has received word the FT4XW operation has been validated for DXCC.

NEPAL, 9N, 9N7AA (op S53R-Robert) is now in a new QTH and has a pair of vertical dipoles up from a fiberglass pole on the terrace of his top floor apartment. He has found the 17-meter band the best for him. His previous gear is still stuck in Kabul and he is trying hard to get it to Nepal.

THAILAND, HS. Brad, VK2BY is QRV as HS0ZNR from the Nam Yuen district until January 21. Activity will be on 80 to 10 meters, and possibly 160 meters, using CW, SSB, and FT8, with two or three stations active.

TURKEY, TA. Simon is temporarily QRV as TA4/G6JFY from Fethieye while waiting for his regular Turkish call sign.

INDONESIA, YB. Special event stations 7B2C, 7B2E, 7B2T, 7B2H and 7B2O are QRV until the end of October 2022 to celebrate the Javanese-Hindu Ceto Temple that was built in 1475. Activity is on 80, 40, 20, 15 and 10 meters using SSB and FT8.

If you, a friend or a family member have been considering getting an Amateur Radio License; this is a great opportunity for a very meaningful New Year's Resolution!

The Cuyahoga Falls Amateur Radio Club is offering a "One-Day Technician Licensing Class". This class will allow students to get their entrance level FCC Amateur Radio license. The class will require reading and prestudy by the students and will include a One-Day, Online Class. Potential students of all ages from any location are invited. Students must register via an online form to participate.

For students to be successful in this class we suggest a multi-pronged approach:

- 1. Before the One-Day session
 - a. Completely read the free class text-*No-Nonsense Technician Class License Study Guide* by Dan Romanchik, KB6NU- *link*
 - b. Take the Review Quizzes listed in Google Classroom
 - c. Optional- view YouTube videos on Tech Licensing (see list)
 - d. After completing a few chapters, begin taking online sample exams

 - ii. www.eham.net/exams
 - iii. http://arrlexamreview.appspot.com
 - iv. www.qrz.com/hamtest
- 2. **Attend the One-Day online session** (Jan 8, 2022, from 8:30 AM to 5 PM)
- 3. Continue taking online sample exams
- 4. **Take your actual exam as soon as possible** after the one-day session (we will be providing a VE Test session at the Akron Public Library, Downtown Branch the day after the One-Day session on Jan 9, 2022 or you can take it near your location or even online)

HAM EXAMS RETURN TO THE KIRTLAND LIBRARY

The Lake County Amateur Radio Association is once again holding its **2022** Amateur Radio license exams at the **Kirtland Library**, 9267 Chillicothe Road, on the following dates:

Saturday, February 5 Saturday, August 6
Saturday, April 2 Saturday, October 1
Saturday, June 4 Saturday, December 3

This bi-monthly schedule is the first Saturday of every even-numbered month (e.g., February being the second month, etc.). They are held at the Kirtland Library, 9267 Chillicothe Road. It is 1.7 miles south of I-90 on Route 306 (Chillicothe Rd). The library is on the left, just beyond the Marathon gas station.

The tests will start at **12 noon.** Please arrive a few minutes earlier.

To register, you will need a NCVEC 605 Form, which will be available at the test. If you would like to complete one ahead of time, be sure it is the Sept 2017 version or later. You can find it by Goggling "NCVEC quick-form 605" and clicking on the url for a copy of the form. Please note **the FCC requires you to provide a FRN** (FCC Registration Number). Social Security Numbers are no longer accepted. If you are new to ham radio and don't have a FRN, Google "New FRN" and follow the apps.fcc.gov link.


If you are currently licensed, be sure to **bring a copy of your license to the exam.** The cost of the exam is \$15.00, and if you wish to pay by check, it should be made out to the ARRL/VEC.

Identification with your picture is also necessary, such as a driver's license. if you have any questions, please contact Scott Farnham, KO8O, at (440)256-0320, or scottfarnham@roadrunner.com

Note that sometime in early 2022, the FCC plans to begin charging \$35 to add you to the Amateur Radio database. This will be payable directly to the FCC, but the timing is unknown.
