DX: {Jim-AA8OY}: JD1/O – Ogasawara Islands JA0JHQ, Nobu, updates us on his current activity from Chichijima Island, Ogasawara where he will be QRV as JD1BOW, from May 27 to June 19.

ZC4 - UK Sovereign Base Areas on Cyprus ZC4RH and 5B4/G4WXJ, Dave Harnett, will be active June 5-15, SSB, CW, probably also some FT8 and the QO-100 satellite too.

Backscatter for July 2022

BACKSCATTER

2262 Years Ago: 240 B.C.: Greek astronomer, geographer, mathematician and librarian of the library of Alexandria, Egypt, Eratosthenes calculates the Earth's circumference, claiming it is big and round.

He knew that at noon on the day of the summer solstice, the sun was observed to be directly overhead at Aswan, as one could see the sun shining to the bottom of a deep well, and a sundial cast no shadow. Yet, to the north at Alexandria, a sundial cast a shadow even at the solstice midday, because the sun was not directly overhead there. Therefore, the Earth must be round — already believed by the astronomers of his day.

What's more, if one assumed the sun to be sufficiently far away to be casting parallel rays at Aswan and Alexandria, it would be possible to figure out the Earth's circumference. Eratosthenes computed the shadow in Alexandria to be 1/50 of a full 360-degree circle. He then estimated the distance between the two locations and multiplied by 50 to derive the circumference.

Of course, his measurements were not precise. Alexandria is not due north of Aswan, but 2 degrees of longitude off. Aswan is not precisely on the Tropic of Cancer but 39 minutes of latitude north of it. The distance between the cities was an estimate.

And we don't know today the exact size of the measurement unit Eratosthenes used when he came up with the final figure of 252,000 states. Depending on which classical source one trusts, his estimate was somewhere between 24,663 and 27,967 miles. The accepted figure for the Earth's equatorial circumference today is 24,902 miles, which was pretty good for a guy without modern measurement tools.

Eratosthenes went further and computed the tilt of the Earth's axis to within a degree. He also deduced the length of the year as 365¼ days, and suggested that calendars should have a leap day every fourth year, an idea taken up two centuries later by Julius Caesar.

It was thus known long before Columbus that the Earth was round and even how big it is, approximately. But it was just not widely known among the masses in 15th-century Europe.

35 Years Ago: Mike, WA8BXN describes the hot packet setup; a Kantronics KPC-2 with a Commodore C-64 computer.

Happy Birthday! President Don, WA8TWM's family increases by one with the birth of Christopher Robert Kocsis.

30 Years Ago: Digital processing meets ham radio with the JPS NF-60 automatic notch filter. Dee, W1HEO says it "is the answer to those who must deal with the increasing number of jammers and nerds who haunt rare DX these days.

In a "Special Hamvention Edition" of the DX Bulletin, Clod Harris reports the ARRL has lost the DXCC data base. This unfortunate occurrence is just two days after all paper records had been incinerated. He also reports that the VOA has acquired the K5UR contest station, stating this will both save money, and "result in a much stronger signal into nearly every corner of the globe."

25 Years Ago: Lenny, WS8O is appointed Emergency Coordinator for Lake County.

Opening July 11th, the movie "Contact" includes a cameo appearance by a ham shack.

Ex DX: Hong Kong VS6 goes QRT as the former British Crown colony becomes part of the People's Republic of China.

Missed deadline: ICOM introduces the IC-706 MKII at Dayton, unfortunately lacking FCC approval.

20 Years Ago: June's meeting features a demonstration of SSTV by Bill Chaikin, KA8VIT and Mike DiTurno, KC8OWL, using a "garden variety PC with a soundcard.

HAM EXAMS AT THE KIRTLAND LIBRARY

The Lake County Amateur Radio Association's VE Team will be holding amateur radio license exam sessions on the following dates during 2022:

Saturday, August 6

Saturday, October 1

Saturday, December 3

This bi-monthly schedule is the first Saturday of every even-numbered month (e.g., February being the second month, etc.). The Kirtland Public Library is located at 9267 Chillicothe Road, 1.7 miles south of I-90 on Route 306 (Chillicothe Rd). The library is on the left, just beyond the Marathon gas station.

The tests will start at 12 noon. Please arrive a few minutes earlier.

To register, you will need a NCVEC 605 Form, which will be available at the test. If you would like to complete one ahead of time, be sure it is the Sept 2017 version or later. You can find it by Goggling "NCVEC quick-form 605" and clicking on the URL for a copy of the form. Please note **the FCC requires you to provide a FRN** (FCC Registration Number). Social Security Numbers are no longer accepted. If you are new to ham radio and don't have a FRN, Google "New FRN" and follow the apps.fcc.gov link.

If you are currently licensed, be sure to **bring a copy of your license to the exam.** The cost of the exam is \$15.00, and if you wish to pay by check, it should be made out to the ARRL/VEC. Identification with your picture, such as a driver's license is also necessary.


In addition the FCC now charges \$35 to add you to the Amateur Radio database. The FCC will e-mail successful candidates with instructions for payment directly to them. Payment must be made within 10 days of the e-mail. This charge does not apply to upgrades.
