- **VU4 Andaman and Nicobar Islands** On April 28 YL2GM, Yuris, began his journey to the Andaman Islands. This is a one man operation using the call sign VU4W.
- **HC8 Galapagos Islands** HC2FG, Gustavo, is heading to Santa Cruz Island, Galapagos Islands where he will be operating as HD8FG from May 4-8.
- **C5 The Gambia** The C5C license application has been approved and the license is good until April 25, 2023. They plan to be QRV. from May 22 to June 8.

A2 - Botswana

As a reminder VE7VR, Dave, will be there April 28 to May 26, call sign A25VR. He is doing a four-wheel-drive camping safari trip.

- **9N Nepal** Polish DXpeditioners SP9FIH, Janusz, and SP6CIK, Leszek, acquired their 9N7WE and 9N7CI licenses on April 25th and began operations. Listen for them on 40, 30, 17, 15, 12, 10 and 6 Meters. They anticipate being QRV probably until the morning of May 19.
- **5X Uganda** 5X7W is by SM0HPL, Anders, from Naalya, Kampala. He is on now to May 10 with 5 watts and an antenna on a fifth story rooftop. He is on 40 meters and up, FT8, FT4 and CW.

Backscatter for June 2022

BACKSCATTER

125 Years Ago: Physicist J.J. Thomson discovers something smaller than an atom, a particle with a minuscule mass and a negative charge.

Director of Cavendish Laboratory at Cambridge University, Thomson was researching electrical currents inside cathode ray tubes. He observed that the rays are deflected by an electric field.

Researchers had been puzzled by cathode rays until Thomson theorized that the rays were in fact streams of small subatomic particles, the first known. He called them "corpuscles," the Latin for "small bodies."

Thomson figured his negatively charged corpuscles accounted for about one-thousandth of the mass of a hydrogen atom (1/1837 is the accepted ratio today), matched by a positive charge elsewhere in the atom. Thomson was vague in 1897 but later theorized that these electrons swarmed around in a "sphere of uniform electrification.

He was awarded the 1906 Nobel Prize "in recognition of the great merits of his theoretical and experimental investigations on the conduction of electricity by gases" and was knighted in 1908.

- **40 Years Ago:** How did he know? Bob, K8BL, speculates the future may bring the "fully automatic QSO", where one arranges a time and frequency, and programs a message into one's computer. "When … the bands are quiet the computers contact each other and exchange their traffic. When you get home, you check your printer and retrieve your messages."
- **35 Years Ago:** Slow Progress: The FCC granted an ARRL request for extension to July 31 of a proposal for private sector issuance of call signs. Only the government could extend three months into what became nine years.
- **30 Years Ago:** 9N1MM SK. Father Moran, for many years the only active ham in Nepal, died at age 85. A Jesuit priest who spent more than 40 years in the Himalayan kingdom, 9N1 Mickey Mouse emigrated from Chicago to Nepal, and for a time served as the Minister of Telecommunications.

25 Years Ago: LCARA's Wednesday night .81/.21 net begins. Need a QSL address, help for an antenna party or a technical problem? Bring your questions and comments. It's free. No reservations needed; jacket optional.

The BS7H DXpedition to Scarborough Reef was cut short after three days. Jim, KF8VX reports that with the reef being claimed by both China and the Philippines, visits were made to the station by the Philippine Air Force and Navy. Although the military was polite to the DXers, the message was received clearly, with the hams quickly weighing anchor.

The ARRL asks the FCC to postpone it's proposed increase in vanity call licenses from \$30 to \$50 until all four vanity call sign gates have been opened.

20 Years Ago: ARRL Liaison Jim, KF8VX reports that nothing new is happening at the ARRL.

Jim, KC8EBR talks his way out of a citation at the club's picnic.

15 Years Ago: With the total elimination of the code requirement, LCARA plans an Extra class, to be held twice a week for four weeks, and to be taught by Jim, KF8VX and Don, WA8TWM.

MAURITIUS 3B8 Fabian, DF3XY is QRV as 3B8/DF3XY until June 2. Activity is holiday style on 40, 30, and 20 meters using SSB and FT8.

GUINEA, 3X. Jean-Philippe, F1TMY is QRV as 3X1A from Conakry. Activity is on 160 to 6 meters, and on Satellite QO-100. His portable activities take place from the Los Islands, IOTA AF-051.

THE GAMBIA, C5. Gerard, F5NVF, Abdel, M0NPT, and Luc, F5RAV will be QRV as C5C from Kololi from May 22 to June 8. Activity will be on 80 to 6 meters using CW, SSB, FT8, FT4, and on Satellite QO-100.

ANGOLA, D2. Mikalai, UT6UY is working in the hospital in Cabinde. He is active as D2UY in his spare time on 40, 20, 15, and 10 meters using mostly CW.

MONGOLIA, JT. Andrey, R9YU and Gennady, R5QA are QRV as JV0YU from the Bayan-Olgii province until June 10. Activity is on 160 meters to 70 centimeters using CW, SSB, and FT8.

MARSHALL ISLANDS, V7. Stewie, WV7MS is now QRV as V73MS from Kwajalein Atoll while working as a firefighter. Activity is in his spare time on 20, 17, and 15 meters between 0600 to 0900z.

TURKS AND CAICOS ISLANDS, VP5. Mario, W4HBW is QRV as VP5MA from Providenciales Island, IOTA NA-002. Activity is on 80, 40, 17, and 10 meters using FT8. His length of stay is unknown.

MARKET REEF, OJO. OJ0JR (OH3JR), Henri; and OJ0MR (OG2M), Pertti, will concentrate on six-meter operations June 26 to July 6, particularly looking for NA, SA and Asia on FT8, CW and SSB.

DJIBOUTI, J2. Djibouti J28JD, Paul, will remain at Camp Lemonier, Djibouti for the rest of the year and currently has a Chameleon sky loop antenna but hopes to be "installing more antennas soon". Soon he plans to have a WSPR beacon on 20 and 30 meters. He occasionally calls CQ on SSB on 10, 20 and 40 meters.

MONACO, 3A Monaco, During "the first half of July 2022" F6EXV, Paul, and PB8DX, Flo, will be taking part in "a special activity on 6m as 3A6M with the help from the local ARM association". They will also be operating on HF as 3A/F6EXV and 3A/PB8DX. (QSL 3A/F6EXV) 3A/PB8DX and 3A6M via F6EXV, using Club Log for direct or bureau requests.

RWANDA, 9X DF2WO (Harald), will be on the air with his 9X2AW call sign June 1-22 from new grid Kl48xe, a different QTH than his past operations. He is preparing a 160M antenna and dipoles and plans to build a hex beam from bamboo, to cover 20, 17, 15 and 10. Harald will be on CW, SSB, RTTY and FT8.

RODRIGUES ISLAND, 3B9 Rodriguez Island 3B9/HB9DBB started May 18. So far, op Jean-Michel has been found on 15M FT8. He also plans CW and SSB, and all primarily on 15.

FIJI, 3D2 SP5ES, Marcin, has arrived in Fiji and is now QRV as 3D2EZ. (Editor's Note: Perhaps he is getting ready to go to Rotuma?) So far he has been reported active on 20 meters CW.

FIJI, 3D2 Fiji - It appears SP5MXZ, Wojtek, has joined 3D2EZ, Marcin, and 3D2USU, Dom, in Fiji. He is now QRV as 3D2SP. So far activity has been on 10 and 28 MHz FT8.

OMAN, A4 A41NN, Mohammed, is using an IC-7800 and running 100 watts into an Optibeam 6/6.

KERGUELEN ISLANDS, FT#X – Kerguelen Islands - FT4XW, Arthur, "has found a location for his equipment and he still has to find a place to install his inverted V".

EGYPT, SU. Egypt - Over that past two years SU1ER, Said, has had success working Japan on 50 MHz during the Eskip season.

MARSHALL ISLANDS, V7. Marshall Islands - WV7MS, Stewie, is now V73MS operating from Roi Namur Island. He is operating with an FT- 857D running 100 watts. He can be found daily on 20, 17 and 15 meters.

FALKLAND ISLANDS, VP8. Falkland Islands - VP8CLE, Dave, and VP8DKW, Carol, are in the Falkland Islands for the 40th Anniversary of the Falklands War. They are there until June 17th.

HAM EXAMS AT THE KIRTLAND LIBRARY

The Lake County Amateur Radio Association's VE Team will be holding amateur radio license exam sessions on the following dates during 2022:

Saturday, June 4

Saturday, August 6

Saturday, October 1

Saturday, December 3

This bi-monthly schedule is the first Saturday of every even-numbered month (e.g., February being the second month, etc.). The Kirtland Public Library is located at 9267 Chillicothe Road, 1.7 miles south of I-90 on Route 306 (Chillicothe Rd). The library is on the left, just beyond the Marathon gas station.

The tests will start at **12 noon.** Please arrive a few minutes earlier.

To register, you will need a NCVEC 605 Form, which will be available at the test. If you would like to complete one ahead of time, be sure it is the Sept 2017 version or later. You can find it by Goggling "NCVEC quick-form 605" and clicking on the URL for a copy of the form. Please note **the FCC requires you to provide a FRN** (FCC Registration Number). Social Security Numbers are no longer accepted. If you are new to ham radio and don't have a FRN, Google "New FRN" and follow the apps.fcc.gov link.

If you are currently licensed, be sure to **bring a copy of your license to the exam.** The cost of the exam is \$15.00, and if you wish to pay by check, it should be made out to the ARRL/VEC. Identification with your picture, such as a driver's license is also necessary.


In addition the FCC now charges \$35 to add you to the Amateur Radio database. The FCC will e-mail successful candidates with instructions for payment directly to them. Payment must be made within 10 days of the e-mail. This charge does not apply to upgrades.
