Backscatter for August 2022

BACKSCATTER

60 Years Ago: The Telstar 1 communications satellite relays the first trans-Atlantic television signal. It was the product of NASA, AT&T, Bell Labs and the French and British national posts, with Bell Labs doing the actual construction.

Telstar was launched July 10 aboard a NASA Delta rocket and placed in an orbit that provided for a narrow, 20-minute transmission period per orbit. Spherical with solar panels, It used a helical antenna to receive microwave signals from the ground station, which were then rebroadcast to the main receiving station in southern England.

President Kennedy was supposed to launch this historic moment in communications with a trans-Atlantic press conference, but the transmission signal was acquired before JFK was ready, so Ernie Banks may have been the first human image relayed across the Atlantic. Needing to kill a little time, the producers picked up a TV broadcast of a major league ballgame between the Philadelphia Phillies and Chicago Cubs from Wrigley Field.

40 Years Ago: The more things change, the more they remain the same. The Patch switches format from 8½ x 11 to the folded size that remained in use for many years.

The annual LCARA picnic is planned by George, WD8OYQ, and Shirley, N8BGL. To be held at Fascination Park, it is to feature sirloin burgers as well as pot luck meals.

35 Years Ago: New members: 1st readings are held for Reno W4OUE and 2nd for Dee, W1HEO.

Ken, N8EIH describes participation in a walleye tournament while a thunderstorm approached. With rods making strange buzzing sounds and sparks jumping through cork handles, Ken, using a wire line, decides to call it a day.

31 Years Ago: The World Wide Web is born. Tim Berners-Lee posted the first web pages summarizing his World Wide Web project, a method of storing knowledge using hypertext documents. It included everything necessary to make the web a reality, including the first browser and server.

This post appeared on the "alt.hypertext" newsgroup, ending a journey that began back in 1980, when Berners-Lee was at CERN, the particle physics lab located near Geneva, Switzerland. There, working with collaborator Robert Cailliau, Berners-Lee began the Enquire project, the forerunner to what would become the web.

- **30 Years Ago:** Bob, K8BL reports that strange and unidentified transmissions on 446.00 were traced by hams to parking lot operators at the Cleveland Grand Prix. One call to the FCC office in Detroit, and a FCC enforcement officer came to Cleveland the following day, resolving the problem.
- **25 Years Ago:** The FCC assigns the call sign N8BC to LCARA. Previously held by the late Bill Benjamin, the call was requested under the vanity call program.
- X YL Sue Bair, N8JCV and Mark Kundrath, KB8FKM are married, leaving the following day for Disney World.
- **20 Years Ago:** Under Programs, Editor Ken Deken, KC8OHF writes that "the October 2 meeting will be our annual 'Homebrew Night!' Don't forget to earn the undying admiration of your fellow LCARA members by displaying your skills. (So what if it means that we will all call you with help on our own projects! You still have our respect!)."
- **15 Years Ago:** Richard Price of Bulldog Battery provided "insight into new types of batteries ... and that yes, there are some expensive batteries that are very good ... but not cost effective for most people."
- **10 Years Ago:** Despite a slow sign-up start, 22 people attend the Club Picnic. No note is made if the menu changed from the picnic held 30 years earlier.

TIMOR-LESTE, 4W. Satoshi, JH2EUV is QRV as 4W/JH2EUV. Activity is on 40 to 10 meters using mostly FT8. His length of stay is unknown.

MAYOTTE, FH. Marek, F4VVJ will be QRV as FH4VVK from Petite-Terre, IOTA AF-027, from August 20 to April 1, 2024.

THAILAND, HS. Brad, VK2FY is QRV as HS0ZNR until September 2. Activity is on 160 to 10 meters.

DJIBOUTI, J2. J28RC is a new club station located in a US Army military camp.

JORDAN, JY. Nart, JY5IB is QRV from Amman and is active on 60 to 12 meters using FT8.

LITHUANIA, LY. Special call sign LY770CT is QRV until October 14 to commemorate the 770th anniversary since the founding of the Lithuanian city of Klaipeda. Activity is on all bands and modes.

HAM EXAMS AT THE KIRTLAND LIBRARY

The Lake County Amateur Radio Association's VE Team will be holding amateur radio license exam sessions on the following dates during 2022:

Saturday, October 1

Saturday, December 3

This bi-monthly schedule is the first Saturday of every even-numbered month (e.g., February being the second month, etc.). The Kirtland Public Library is located at 9267 Chillicothe Road, 1.7 miles south of I-90 on Route 306 (Chillicothe Rd). The library is on the left, just beyond the Marathon gas station.

The tests will start at 12 noon. Please arrive a few minutes earlier.

To register, you will need a NCVEC 605 Form, which will be available at the test. If you would like to complete one ahead of time, be sure it is the Sept 2017 version or later. You can find it by Goggling "NCVEC quick-form 605" and clicking on the URL for a copy of the form. Please note **the FCC requires you to provide a FRN** (FCC Registration Number). Social Security Numbers are no longer accepted. If you are new to ham radio and don't have a FRN, Google "New FRN" and follow the apps.fcc.gov link.

If you are currently licensed, be sure to **bring a copy of your license to the exam.** The cost of the exam is \$15.00, and if you wish to pay by check, it should be made out to the ARRL/VEC. Identification with your picture, such as a driver's license is also necessary.


In addition the FCC now charges \$35 to add you to the Amateur Radio database. The FCC will e-mail successful candidates with instructions for payment directly to them. Payment must be made within 10 days of the e-mail. This charge does not apply to upgrades.
