# **Backscatter for February 2023**

#### **BACKSCATTER**

**195 Years Ago:** The first U.S. hotel to install bathrooms was the Tremont House, Boston, Mass., for which the cornerstone was laid on July 4.

**72 Years Ago:** The invention of the junction transistor was announced by Dr. William Shockley in Murray Hill, N.J. This new type of transistor overcame the problems of the earlier point-contact transistor. A three-layer sandwich, the outer layers were semiconductors with too many electrons (known as N-type) and the inner layer was the opposite with too few (known as P-type). They weren't up to the point-contact transistor's ability to handle signals that fluctuated extremely rapidly, but in every other way they were superior. They were much more efficient, used very little power, and generated so much less electrical noise they could handle weaker signals than the type-A transistors ever could.

**45 Years Ago:** We're coordinated! Despite initial misgivings, the Ohio Area Repeater Council (OARC) approves our use of 147.81/.21

The ARRL approves of LCARA being an affiliated club, and have remained one ever since, plus becoming a Special Service Club years later.

LCARA provides communications for the News Herald's Johnnycake Jog.

- **40 Years Ago:** The FCC drops the requirement for logging of all QSO's, including 3<sup>rd</sup> party traffic. Accordingly, the auto patch procedure is changed so it is no longer necessary to identify both parties at the end of a patch.
- 35 Years Ago: 1st readings are held for Arlene Patterson KB8DUC, and Jim Capps W8AEB.
- **30 Years Ago:** A Florida ham is fined \$50,000, jailed for 60 days, and loses his license for sending false maydays. He could have been fined \$250,000.

N8ZZZ is issued. Future Tech & General calls will come from the Novice call block, starting with KB8P--

**25 Years Ago:** Microwave equipment is purchased to upgrade the .81/.21 links. The 430MHz links run full duplex at 7.5 watts. Yagis will be used to link the remote inputs with the Painesville site.

Barry Goldwater K7UGA, SK

**20 Years Ago:** Under protection of the Israeli army, Eitan 4Z5MK, operates from the Gaza Strip, part of Palestine, E4. But as it is not approved by Palestine, it doesn't count.

**15 Years Ago:** Ron KC8BTN, Vance KA8YHZ, and Bill N8IJG, set up three stations at the Mentor Public Library to demonstrate amateur radio for Kid's Day. By the end of the day 25 kids plus 8 parents had the experience of operating a radio station.

**10 Years Ago:** 144 years after Samuel F. B. Morse sent the first telegram in Washington DC, **t**he final commercial telegram is sent from India.

**5 Years Ago:** The new Bridge Com 220 MHz is on the air!

**EQUATORIAL GUINEA, 3C** Ersoy, TA2OM is QRV as 3C3CA from Bioco Island,

**LESOTHO, 7P** Schalk, A22LL has moved here and is now QRV as 7P8LL. Activity is on 80 to 6 meters.

**ST. PIERRE AND MIQUELON, FP**. Eric, KV1J will be QRV as FP/KV1J from June 27 until July 11. Activity will be on 80 to 6 meters using CW, SSB, and various digital modes, with a focus on 60 and 6 meters.

**GUAM, KH2.** Yas, JA1QQU will be QRV as KH2/JA1QQU from June 29 to July 4. Activity will be on the HF bands from 2300 to 0200 and 1000 to 1400 UTC.

**MYANMAR, XZ**. Akio, JE2QIZ is QRV as XZ2B from Yangon until the end of September. Activity is on 15, 12, 10, and 6 meters using CW.

# HAM EXAMS in 2023 Held At KIRTLAND PUBLIC LIBRARY

The Lake County Amateur Radio Association is once again holding its Amateur Radio license exams at the **Kirtland Library**, 9267 Chillicothe Road, on the following dates:

Saturday, August 5 Saturday, October 7 Saturday, December 2


This bi-monthly schedule is the first Saturday of every even-numbered month (e.g., February being the second month, etc.). They are held at the Kirtland Library, 9267 Chillicothe Road. It is 1.7 miles south of I-90 on Route 306 (Chillicothe Rd). The library is on the left, just beyond the Marathon gas station.

The tests will start at **12 noon.** Please arrive a few minutes earlier.

To register, you will need a NCVEC 605 Form, which will be available at the test. If you would like to complete one ahead of time, be sure it is the Sept 2017 version or later. You can find it by Googling "NCVEC quick-form 605" and clicking on the url for a pdf of the form. Please note **the FCC requires you to provide a FRN** (FCC Registration Number). Social Security Numbers are no longer accepted. If you are new to ham radio and don't have a FRN, Google "New FRN" and follow the fcc.gov link.

If you are currently licensed, be sure to **bring a copy of your license to the exam.** The cost of the exam itself is \$15.00, and if you wish to pay by check, it should be made out to the ARRL/VEC. Identification with your picture is also necessary, such as a driver's license. If you have any questions, please contact Scott Farnham, KO8O, at (440) 256-0320, or <a href="mailto:scottfarnham@roadrunner.com">scottfarnham@roadrunner.com</a>

**In addition** to the \$15 test fee, the FCC now charges \$35 to add you to the Amateur Radio database. The FCC will e-mail successful candidates instructions for payment directly to them. Payment must be made within 10 days of the e-mail. This charge does not apply to upgrades.



#### LICENSE RENEWAL (revised)

Doing our VE Tests, I often am asked how to renew one's license. It's been five years since I checked, so it seems time to check how much the process has changed. The answer is ... \$35. Starting about a year ago, the FCC has added a fee to update the database. Now there are two steps:

Step 1: Request an upgrade with the FCC. This costs between zero and \$15, depending on how you go about it. These \$\$ go to the ARRL or W5YI (see below).

Step 2: Then pay \$35 directly to the FCC.

#### STEP 1:

This can be simple and free, or cost \$8, or cost \$15, or be a real PITA. Renewals can only be made within 90 days of expiration. If you're a little late, don't sweat it, as there's a two year grace period.

There are several ways you can go about requesting your license be renewed:

- 1. If you're an ARRL member (you are, aren't you ... it is the best deal in amateur radio, and they need your support to defend our frequencies), fill out the NCVEC Form 605, available in pdf from several sources if you Google "NCVEC Form 605". Then mail it with a note that it's a renewal request to: ARRL/VEC at 225 Main St, Newington CT 06111. It's free. If you do this, make sure your Form 605 is the Sept 2017 version or later, and include your FRN, which is probably on your current license. Check the "FCC ULS" database if it isn't. Note that social security numbers are no longer are accepted.
- 2. If you're not an ARRL member, you can do the same thing, but enclose a \$15 check payable to ARRL/VEC with the form...

- 3. You can have W5YI do it for you at <a href="www.w5yi.org">www.w5yi.org</a> Click on "License Renewals" along the left side of the screen and follow the instructions. This costs \$8. Or mail a completed NCVEC Form 605 and \$8 to them at W5YI-VEC, PO Box 200065, Arlington, TX 76006-0065
- 4. You can do it yourself directly with the FCC. Google "FCC ULS" Click on "UNIVERSAL LICENSING SYSTEM" then click "FILE ONLINE" which takes you to the FCC License Manager page and follow the instructions. This is NOT easy. Note that it has been reported the FCC no longer accepts paper requests for renewal.

If you really don't have a FRN number, on the FCC License Manager in 4 above, click on "Register with the FCC" and follow the instructions. Be sure to link your new FRN with your existing license. After receiving a FRN, you can go back to the ULS Home Page and click on ONLINE FILING to request an update/renewal to your license..

Regardless of which method you choose, if the US Postal Service is not involved, it may be as quick as one or two days. You are now ready go on to

#### STEP 2:

The FCC will e-mail you a request to pay \$35 via a credit card. This must be done within 10 business days. They will then change the database to show your new expiration date. They no longer mail licenses; you have to print it out from the FCC ULS site.
