BACKSCATTER

149 Years Ago: Frank Conrad is born. Frank was an electrical engineer whose interest in radiotelephony led to the establishment of the first commercial radio station, KDKA. An amateur working for Westinghouse at its East Pittsburgh Works, he built a transmitting station on the second floor of the garage behind his home in Wilkinsburg, Pa. Substituting a phonograph for his microphone, he discovered a large audience of listeners who had built their own crystal radio sets and who, upon hearing the music, wrote or phoned requests for more music and news. When he became swamped with these requests, he coined the term "broadcast" and scheduled programs to satisfy his listeners. Don't try this today.

90 Years Ago: QRN? Karl Jansky, working for Bell Telephone Labs in Holmdel N.J announces the discovery of radio waves from the center of the Milky Way galaxy. The very low intensity signal, just below 15 meters, required sensitive apparatus for its detection. Its intensity varied regularly with the time of day and the season, and came from an unchanging direction in space, proving it was not of terrestrial origin.

45 Years Ago: LCARA's 1st newsletter is published, the May 1978 issue. Members vote to add an auto patch line to the new repeater, WD8DQW/RPT on .81/21

Oops. Frequency coordination of the new repeater with the Ohio Area Repeater Council hits a snag. It may have to change frequencies!

It is proposed to move the regular monthly meeting to be held May 31st from the Painesville Perkins to the Lake County Federal Savings and Loan meeting room. "The room has a kitchen, carpeting, great atmosphere, and (perhaps best of all) costs us nothing."

40 Years Ago: The German DXpedition to the Spratley Islands is lost. After being fired upon as they approached the island, distress signals were heard from the 51' catamaran Siddhartha. Ships and planes are searching the area for wreckage.

Remember Tom Swifties? "Someone keeps kerchunking the machine", said Tom repeatedly.

35 Years Ago: Programs are introduced to the Lake County Hamfest. Videotape of the DXpedition to Navassa is shown (it's a small rock between Jamaica and Haiti). Jim Nestor, N8GJR, the computer columnist

for the Plain Dealer hosts a SRO session on PC's in the shack. And on an ever-needed topic, Bob Winston, W2THU talks about hams and the law.

30 Years Ago: The FCC, having taken away 220-222 MHz, thinks about giving hams access to 219-220 MHz ...didn't happen.

25 Years Ago: LCARA votes to spend \$6000 to upgrade the remote inputs and links on .81/.21 with 900MHz microwave equipment.

Mark Kundrath, KB8FKM wins his tower battle with Fairport. Since the Village's zoning laws and ordinances had no sections or parts relating to communications towers of any type, the zoning board concluded they must not be permitted. After six months and \$1000 of legal and engineering fees, Mark finally prevails.

20 Years Ago: Newsletter Editor Grant, N0XIL adds an Event Calendar to The Patch.

LCARA secretary Dennis, AB8NI rants in The Patch on club apathy.

Hamfest Chairman Tom, KB8WFD, points out that both the Ashland Area Amateur Radio Club and the Canfield ham fests have been cancelled. Tom adds this "is not a good thing" and that "seldom when a ham fest is cancelled will it be revived."

15 Years Ago: No newsletter is published.

10 Years Ago: The Patch has grown to a record 36 pages.

Where? Jim, AA8OY gives information on an upcoming DX pedition to Lakshadweep Islands. Hints: It's name means "one hundred thousand islands" in Sanskrit, and it's prefix is VU7.

5 Years Ago: Larry Leasko, WB8PHI is declared "Ham of the Year."



Annual Armed Forces Day Crossband Test

The US Department of Defense (DoD) will host this year's Armed Forces Day (AFD) Crossband Test on May 13, 2023. This annual event is open to all licensed amateur radio operators and will not impact any public or private communications. For more than 50 years, military and amateur stations have taken part in this event.

The AFD Crossband Test is a unique opportunity to test two-way communications between military communicators and radio stations in the Amateur Radio Service (ARS), as authorized in 47 CFR 97.111. These tests provide opportunities and challenges for radio operators to demonstrate individual technical skills in a tightly controlled exercise scenario.

Military stations will transmit on selected frequencies and will announce the specific ARS frequencies monitored. All of the times are Zulu (Z),

DoD MARS - Armed Forces Day.

AFD is a time of honor. It will be celebrated on Saturday, May 20, 2023. The first AFD was celebrated with parades, open houses, receptions, and air shows. Today, many events and activities take place and may include multi-service military displays in areas open to the public, various educational activities that teach children about the armed forces, and large parades with local celebrations.

The longest running AFD parade in the United States is held in Chattanooga, Tennessee. Certain types of music will be played at AFD 2023 events to show respect to those in the armed forces who died for their country.

Making a Big Decision -- Together

Dear member,

For only the second time in 22 years, we are considering a dues increase. Promoting and protecting amateur radio requires a strong and vibrant ARRL. Paying our dues (and some of you go above and beyond) is one way each of us does our part.

In my column in the April issue of QST (read now), I introduced the following question:

How does ARRL handle an increase in dues?

On May 1, we will launch an online survey, inviting all ARRL members to participate. The survey will include some short questions about raising dues and modifying the way some membership benefits are bundled. The survey will also include an opportunity to share your feedback. The participation of every member is important.

Do this before May 1: Review your ARRL website account

Before you can take the survey in May, you'll need to make sure you have a working ARRL website account that is associated with your membership.

Follow these steps:

- 1. Go to www.arrl.org/take-dues-survey. This is a member-only page.
- 2. If you are already logged in to your account, you'll see **CONGRATULATIONS!** on the members-only page that will host the survey in May.
- 3. If you are NOT already logged in to your account, follow the instructions on the page to log in. Or, select the Login button at the top of the web page, and you will be prompted to enter your ARRL website username (usually your call sign) and password. If you have not logged in since April 2022, please use these Login Instructions.

4. **The survey will open on May 1.** Return to this web page to take the survey on, or after, May 1: www.arrl.org/take-dues-survey.

If you need additional help with your login, call us Monday - Thursday from 8 AM to 7 PM ET, and Friday from 8 AM to 5 PM ET at 860-594-0200 or email us at membership@arrl.org.

We'll send an update on May 1 once the survey is live.

HAM EXAMS in 2023 Held At KIRTLAND PUBLIC LIBRARY

The Lake County Amateur Radio Association is once again holding its Amateur Radio license exams at the **Kirtland Library**, 9267 Chillicothe Road, on the following dates:

Saturday, June 3
Saturday, August 5
Saturday, October 7 Saturday, December 2

This bi-monthly schedule is the first Saturday of every even-numbered month (e.g., February being the second month, etc.). They are held at the Kirtland Library, 9267 Chillicothe Road. It is 1.7 miles south of I-90 on Route 306 (Chillicothe Rd). The library is on the left, just beyond the Marathon gas station.

The tests will start at **12 noon.** Please arrive a few minutes earlier.

To register, you will need a NCVEC 605 Form, which will be available at the test. If you would like to complete one ahead of time, be sure it is the Sept 2017 version or later. You can find it by Googling "NCVEC quick-form 605" and clicking on the url for a pdf of the form. Please note **the FCC requires you to provide a FRN** (FCC Registration Number). Social Security Numbers are no longer accepted. If you are new to ham radio and don't have a FRN, Google "New FRN" and follow the fcc.gov link.

If you are currently licensed, be sure to **bring a copy of your license to the exam.** The cost of the exam itself is \$15.00, and if you wish to pay by check, it should be made out to the ARRL/VEC. Identification with your picture is also necessary, such as a driver's license. If you have any questions, please contact Scott Farnham, KO8O, at (440) 256-0320, or scottfarnham@roadrunner.com

In addition to the \$15 test fee, the FCC now charges \$35 to add you to the Amateur Radio database. The FCC will e-mail successful candidates instructions for payment directly to them. Payment must be made within 10 days of the e-mail. This charge does not apply to upgrades.



LICENSE RENEWAL

Doing our VE Tests, I often am asked how to renew one's license. It's been five years since I checked, so it seems time to check how much the process has changed. The answer is not much ... it can be simple and free (there's no FCC fee, which only applies to new licenses), or cost \$8, or be a real PITA. Here's what I found:

This applies to renewals, address changes, and any other modifications to your license information, as well as printing a duplicate license. Renewals can only be made within 90 days of expiration. If you're a little late, don't sweat it, as there's a two year grace period.

There are several ways you can go about renewing or changing your license information:


- 1. If you're an ARRL member (you are, aren't you ... it is the best deal in amateur radio, and they need your support to defend our frequencies), fill out the NCVEC Form 605, available in pdf from several sources if you Google "NCVEC Form 605". Then mail it with a note as to whether it's a renewal/change/duplicate request to ARRL/VEC at 225 Main St, Newington CT 06111. It's free. If you do this, make sure your Form 605 is the Sept 2017 version or later.
- 2. If you're not an ARRL member, you can do the same thing, but enclose a \$15 check payable to ARRL/VEC with the form.
- 3. You can have W5YI do it for you at www.w5yi.org Click on "License Renewals" along the left side of the screen and follow the instructions. This costs \$8. Or mail a completed NCVEC Form 605 and \$8 to them at W5YI-VEC, PO Box 200065, Arlington, TX 76006-0065
- 4. You can do it yourself directly with the FCC. Google "FCC ULS" Click on "UNIVERSAL LICENSING SYSTGEM" then click "FILE ONLINE" which takes you to the FCC License Manager page and follow the instructions. If you have been assigned a FRN this is easy. The considerable majority of existing amateurs have been assigned a FRN, and it is shown on your current license. Check your license using "License Search" at the "FCC ULS Home" page above.
- 5. If you really don't have a FRN number, on the FCC License Manager in 4 above, click on "Register with the FCC" and follow the instructions. Be sure to link your new FRN with your existing license. After receiving a

FRN You can go back to the ULS Home Page and click on ONLINE FILING to request an update/renewal to your license. Note that many older licenses have had FRN's automatically assigned.

6. If you're not an ARRL member, hate the internet, and too cheap to pay \$8, you can fill out a paper copy of FCC Form 605 and send it directly to the FCC. Note this **FCC** Form 605 is entirely different from the **NCVEC** Form 605 mentioned in method 1 above. You can request this form from the FCC Forms Distribution Center at 1-800-418-3676, or download it at www.fcc.gov/fcc-form-605. This method is only recommended for masochists, as the **FCC** Form 605 is a typical government form, being both long and far from intuitively obvious.

Regardless of which method you choose, your renewed license will show up in the FCC's database shortly. If the US Postal Service is not involved, it may be as quickly as one or two days. The FCC no longer mails licenses, you will have to print it out from the FCC ULS site.
